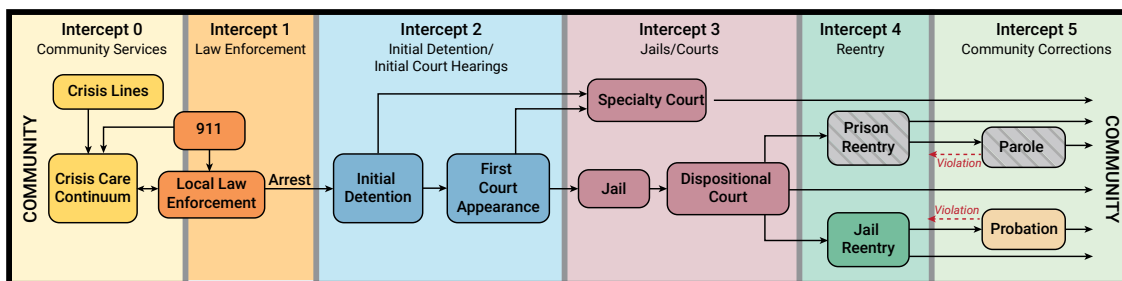

ABOUT THIS WORKSHOP

This workshop is designed to tap into local expertise by convening key stakeholders to develop a Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) that illustrates how people with mental and substance use disorders come in contact with and flow through the local criminal justice system. This map identifies opportunities and resources for diverting people to treatment and gaps in services. PRA has facilitated workshops for communities across the United States and has been at the forefront of the model's evolution, including the development of Intercept 0 and a renewed emphasis on front-end strategies to reduce incarceration.
