However, just about when we got started, the pandemic hit, and our ability to use those machines became null and void, since staff couldn't come in to use them, and they couldn't take them home. We had to switch resources and purchase iPads to use the Zoom platform. By adjusting our plans, we could stay connected with people throughout the pandemic and help provide support for them.


