

FAQs: The GAINS Center’s Learning Collaborative on Addressing Housing upon Reentry to Support Community Reintegration and Prevent Homelessness

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

JANUARY 2026

What is the Learning Collaborative commitment?

All 2026 Learning Collaborative (LC) events are planned to be delivered virtually. The LC will start in February 2026 and run through August 2026. The core components will include kickoff calls with each team, an opening convening session, an ask-the-expert (ATE) series, intensive technical assistance (TA), and a closing event. Selected teams will also participate in coaching sessions to review progress on targeted goals, identify new barriers, and discuss potential TA.

What is the ATE series?

The purpose of the ATE series is to share information and generate discussion among the subject-matter experts (SMEs) and LC team members. The ATE series for this LC will consist of three topical TA sessions to provide the opportunity for LC teams to take a “deep dive” into core TA topics with identified SMEs. Each topical session in the series will consist of a substantive presentation on the topic/issue, followed by an opportunity for team members to engage in a Q&A-style discussion. Potential topics include pre-release planning for people leaving jails and prisons, including preventing homelessness; exploring the principles of risk, needs, and responsibility to ensure treatment and supervision meet intended goals; and peer support in reentry.

What community partnerships are required for this LC application?

Local jurisdictions applying are encouraged to identify a multidisciplinary team that includes representation from agencies directly involved in the development, implementation, coordination, and delivery of reentry and housing services in the community. Suggested team members include community behavioral health providers, community supervision (probation and parole), law enforcement and first responder organizations, the local housing authority, and peers or recovery support providers.

Do you anticipate any follow-up funding opportunities for implementation?

Follow-up funding opportunities will not be available as part of the Learning Collaboratives. Technical assistance will be made available throughout the duration of the Learning Collaboratives through August 2026.

What are some of the TA opportunities?

Each participating team will have the opportunity to request up to 16 hours of intensive technical assistance (TA) or its equivalent. Generally, these hours will be devoted to a single TA event (e.g., workshop, training, SME consultation, court observation, review of intake/

assessment forms, etc.) but may be spread out over multiple sessions if circumstances and site TA needs warrant. GAINS Center staff will work with each team throughout the LC to assist with the identification and provision of the intensive TA work. All TA provided as part of the LC will be delivered virtually.

How many awards do you expect to make?

The number of awards varies by Learning Collaborative and is based on the number of applications we receive. We are looking to select approximately six teams for this LC.

If I applied for the Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) Mapping Workshop or a How Being Trauma-Informed Improves Criminal Justice System Responses Train-the-Trainer (TTT) event, am I eligible for these LCs?

Absolutely. You may also apply for additional Learning Collaborative opportunities as those opportunities become available, and you may apply for as many opportunities for which you have an interest. Please note that each Learning Collaborative will require submission of a separate application specific to each opportunity.
